Welcome to our new starters. Our children have been so helpful settling all our new children into the setting.

Learning this week:

This week we start our 'Growth and Change' theme. Children will be planting sunflowers and observing how they grow and change. We will also be looking at animals and people and how they are as babies, and how they grow.



Talk to your child about:

- What where you like as a baby?
- How are you different now?

Core Story:

This week's core story is the traditional tale, 'Jack and the Beanstalk.' Children will be joining in with repeated phrases, making predictions about the story and describing characters.

Our Dragonfly children will be reading 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear,' by Eric Carle. They will be answering 'what' questions and learning about colours.

Wonderful Word of the Week: 'growing'

Each week, we introduce our children to a 'wonderful word of the week.' This week the word is 'Spring.'



Talk to your child about:

- What grows?
- How has it changed?
- How is it the same?

Makaton Sign of the Week: 'happy'

Each week, we learn to sign a new word.

Poetry Basket: 'From Spawn to Frog'

Every half term we learn 2 -3 short poems. This week the children will be reciting the poem, 'From Spawn to Frog'.

Talking Tub

This week's talking tub and non-fiction books are about 'Spring'



Talk to your child about:

- What is in the talking tub?
- What grows in Spring?
- What changes in Spring?

Our progression focus is: - technical vocabulary.

PSED

In PSED groups this half term, our theme is 'Being Healthy.' We will be learning about different ways to keep healthy. We will also be learning about sun safety.

This week in Woodlands, we will be reading the story 'Bug Hotel' and we will be making our own bug hotel.

Masterclass

Each half term, our school leaver children participate in a Masterclass. This term's Masterclass is Gardening Classes. The children will be working in our allotment, planting flowers, fruit and vegetables and looking after them. They will observe how they grow.
